


Bill Allen shows a bird house that his son had made when he was a Boy Scout during a bird house making project.

Stone explained that once a death has been reported, the autopsy is done immediately, either the same day, or by the next day.

Raton teens take their act to Portales

Hot off the success of their Shuler Theatre production, Raton's teen thespians took their act on the road last week to garner awards at Eastern New Mexico University's annual Drama Festival.

After a final Shuler performance of Stephen Gregg's one-act comedy "Why Do We Laugh," Tuesday evening, the entire production by Raton Youth Theatre and the newly-resurrected Raton High School Drama Club was loaded onto the Raton High School activity bus early Wednesday morning and transported to Portales.

After Raton's 35-minute presentation Thursday evening, the Drama Festival's judges met with the troupe to give critiques and three awards. The production received the highest available rating, Superior, in Staging. Impressed that this young acting company was formed only last month, the judges created an award for "Excellence in the Formation of a New Theatre Troupe."

Finally, instead of giving acting awards to stand-out performers, the judges complimented the Raton group for their impressive ensemble work and gave their "Excellence in Acting" award to the entire cast.

The Raton teens also participated in a variety of acting workshops and saw plays performed by more than twenty other high schools from throughout New Mexico. One judge told the Raton group, "We saw lots of plays full of adolescent humor, going for the easy laugh, but your production was like "The Little Engine That Could": it just built and built, and it captured us. It built to a great climax. I loved your choice of play."

Another judge thought the play was a bold choice because it requires sophisticated work on the part of each actor. In "Why Do We Laugh", all eight actors are on stage the entire time. The judges praised their success at staying entirely in character throughout the play, even when faced with distractions like ringing cell phones and closing doors that can throw off more-sea-

soned performers. He said, "I could never see you thinking ahead, or thinking of your lines. All of you remained convincingly - impressively - in character."

Artistic director Gail Dixon-Willden praised her young cast and crew. "They did extremely well. They captured the audience's attention from the moment they started and held it all through the play," she said. "I'm really proud of them."

Actor Jeffery Redlick said, "The best thing I learned from this trip is that with teamwork and support from your friends and supervisors, you can do whatever you put your mind to."

The group will continue to meet at Enchanted Grounds Espresso Bar & Café in Raton every Wednesday afternoon at 3:00 pm. Open to all area teens, they are looking for new people to participate in acting or on the backstage crew. One of the questions to be addressed this Wednesday will be, "What's next?"
