Raton Commission met Monday

Commissioners met in special meeting Monday evening to make up for the missed meeting last week.

Commissioners' first item of business was to appoint two new members to the lodger's tax advisory board. Barbara Riley owner of a local bed and breakfast along with Arvind Sinha the owner of the Colt Hotel were appointed to fill two vacancies on the board.

Commissioners then approved a memorandum of understanding with the Raton Little League. The League will be required to put up a \$1000 refundable security deposit for use of the fields and a non-refundable \$50 fee per keyed facility that will be used to rekey all locks upon expiration of the use agreement.

Commissioners then approved a lease agreement with International Bank for new SUVs for the police department. Law Enforcement protection funds will be pledged to help cover the lease.

The audit committee met and recommended that the city continue with Moss Adams as the city's auditor to finish out the third year of the three year contract. The committee also noted that other communities are having problems finding qualified auditors and found that some communities are two to three years behind on their audits.

Juvenile cited in stabbing of another juvenile

Sunday evening at 7:30 p.m. Raton Police Officer Jim Valdez was driving near the 100 block of Galisteo Avenue when he noticed several young people who appeared to be fighting. After sorting through the crowd, interviewing witnesses, and searching the area, with the help of other officers, Officer Valdez cited one juvenile, 14, for stabbing another juvenile, 16. The victim was transported to Miner's Colfax Medical Center for treatment. The juvenile who stabbed the victim in the right side of his back was cited for aggravated battery, resisting and obstructing, and tampering with evidence. The weapon was found a short distance near the area where the victim had been stabbed. According to Chief Sisneros, the juvenile who was cited was later released into his parent's custody.

limited number of proposals in the past and that some firms have a limited knowledge of electric utilities which will make it more difficult to procure a qualified auditor.

Commissioners then tabled a resolution on the support of a fuel farm storage tank funding application until the city can look into funding ideas for the \$118,000 the city will need for their half of the \$237,000 project.

Commissioners then approved a resolution supporting the funding of a game fence around the airport. The cost of this project will be funded 95 percent by the FAA with the city and state covering 2.5 percent each of the estimated \$1,000,000 price tag for the project.

The city is still dealing with a 7 to 8 percent deficit from gross receipts taxes for this year however with upcoming construction projects the city will hopefully see

an improvement in those numbers. City Manager P.J. Mileta has been working with department heads to find ways of cutting their budgets or at least keeping them as tight as possible. The city will see some savings with the reduction of help this summer.

Mileta noted in his report that the environmental review is complete on the CDBG grant in northeast Raton and bids should be in by late May or early June. Mileta also noted that the ground breaking ceremony will be at 10 a.m. Monday for the new recreation center. The pool area and foundation has been dug out already.

Commissioners then went into closed session to discuss the city manager.

The Raton City Commission will meet again next Tuesday for their regular meeting.

daunted, but gave it a try. Blanche has been living within her ever since.

Engel grew up in Matewan, Minnesota, population 60, and attended a one-room school which had an art day every week. In fifth grade, she rewrote the story of Rumpelstiltskin into a play, then she produced, directed, and starred as The Queen. She was 10.

She continued in theatre through high school, then gave it up. "I was never educated in the theatre," she remarks. She married and raised children. But in her mid-30s, someone found out about the hidden actress inside Engel: "I was drafted by community theatre." She went on to found "Theatre at the Fort" with the director Tillman. They produced one play each summer for eight years, with Engel helping the director, "playing house mother to all the actors", and taking lead roles.

After retiring in Minnesota, Engel moved to Zihuatanejo, Mexico. Through a circuitous route, that led her to Arizona, then, in 2004, to Raton. She's been called upon to coach actors in movement and character development. She appeared in the 2006 and 2008 productions of "A Christmas Carol" at the Shuler Theatre. She's hoping to have a dream role in Raton soon, playing one of the old ladies in "Arsenic and Old Lace."

Saturday evening, Tennessee Williams's two women will share the same dress. Engel borrowed a hat for Amanda Wingfield this week from a downtown Raton shop. It has feathers. Wingfield and Blanche DuBois are very different from each other. Engel will bring each to life in key scenes from

their respective plays.

Live at Studio C is beginning its third season of presenting live music, theatre, storytelling, and poetry on the last Saturday of each month through Thanksgiving. A \$3 cover charge is distributed to local arts projects. Located at 517 Broadway, which is the Clayton Highway, Studio C is an art gallery, store, art school, community center, and performance space. Live at Studio C begins at 5:30 p.m. Saturday with an open mike for all comers and all ages. Once, an eighty-year-old woman was fol-

lowed by an eight-year-old girl. There are usually a pair of scheduled spotlight acts. Finally, the featured act is presented. The whole show lasts 2-3 hours, with Raton patrons reaching home just as the scenic drive turns dark with night-fall.
