New York Jets '69 Super Bowl defensive star played for Coach Latuda at TSJC

With so much interest in the New York Jets' attempts to reach this year's Super Bowl, most football fans probably aren't aware that Randy Beverly, the defensive star cornerback who snared two interceptions off an MVP quarterback in the Jets' only Super Bowl appearance in 1969, starred for Trinidad State Junior College's 1962 National Junior College Athletic Association national champions after his recruitment from his East Coast home.

Trinidad native Charlie Latuda, former TSJC football coach and athletic director who coached that 1962 TSJC title team, said he recently got a call from Beverly, now 66, to renew old acquaintances and discuss how the other was doing. Latuda said the two have conversed occasionally through the years since Beverly retired from playing football. "He still calls me 'coach.'"

Latuda said he thought Beverly was still active coaching football for a high school team in New York state. After graduating from TSJC, Beverly went on to play for and graduate from Colorado State University. From 1967 through '69, Beverly played cornerback for the Jets. He ended his pro career in 1971 with the New England Patriots and totaled 10 regular season interceptions for his five-year pro career.

While Broadway Joe Namath got most of the national publicity in the 11-3 Jets' shocking 16-7 Super Bowl upset over the 18-point favored 13-1 Baltimore Colts

Dante Sparaco's essay takes him to nationals

RATON - Although no one at Raton VFW Post 1793 can remember ever placing a local student's essay at the state level, this year they're thrilled to be sending two, led by young Dante Sparaco's 1st place in New Mexico for his entry in the annual middle-school division Patriot's Pen essay competition; Sparaco and his essay will be among the 50 competing for national awards at the VFW's annual convention in San Antonio, Texas, in June.

Son of Jennifer and Dino Sparaco, 12-year-old Dante credits two of his teachers with helping him to develop his writing skills. His English teachers - Joelyn Pafford last year, and sixth grade teacher Amy Elliott this year - have been most helpful, he says. "I like to read, and I listen in class and work hard." Indeed, his father adds, "We're all voracious readers at home, and it's helped Dante to be a great student. He's never earned a grade lower than A."

Dante says that Elliot required everyone in his class to write a Patriot's Pen essay, then offered extra credit to those who actually submitted the essay for competition. "I thought that entering the contest would be a good way to express how I've been feeling about the wars," he says.

Titled "Does Patriotism Still Matter?," Dante's essay points out that, "During this country's birth, patriotism wasn't something you expressed; it was something you lived." He says, "Patriotism is the glue that holds our country together...Patriotism is a reminder to our enemies that this country still stands for something, that there are still people willing to live and die for the belief and love of their country."

"Government is reminded that they work for the people and the American people will hold them to a certain standard. Finally, patriotism matters to me because I care for my country and all of

the people who put their lives on the line for it every day."

Dante is an avid sports fan and gifted athlete who participates in football, baseball, basketball, hunting, and fishing. A fan of the Oregon Ducks and the Notre Dame Fighting Irish, his goal is to become a successful quarterback on a professional football team.

"Dante's been gifted as both a student and an athlete," says his father, Dino, "but he's gotten a lot more recognition for his athletics

than his academic abilities. We're real excited to see him get this recognition from the VFW."

The family will travel to Albuquerque Feb. 12, when the VFW will present its essay awards at its annual state convention. As New Mexico's 1st place winner, Dante's earned a place at the June national convention, as well. It turns out that being a gifted writer can lead to a lot of driving, though no one in the Sparaco family seems to mind.
