# New tourism initiative discussed at TCF

With 14,000 people per day traveling on Interstate 25, the effort to attract more and more of those people to stop in Trinidad and see what it has to offer has become increasingly important to the city's economic future. A new initiative proposed by the Trinidad Community Foundation (TCF) was discussed at a gathering of community leaders held Friday at Trinidad State Junior College.

The initiative would involve a new website called [www.lasanimascounty.tours.com](http://www.lasanimascounty.tours.com), and utilize something called a "QR Reader" to help visitors find out about this area's cultural, historical and recreational attractions. The QR Reader is a quick and easy application that can be downloaded for free from the Inter-

net and used on multiple computer-based devices, including smart phones and computerized tablets.

TCF's Col. Lou Simpleman (Ret.) gave a presentation about the new website and the potential

for boosting tourism by the full development of the potential of the QR Reader. Simpleman said TCF was not trying to intrude on other tourism efforts by other entities in the city, but was trying to build a coalition to move those efforts forward.

QR code, or Quick Response Code, is the trademark for a type of matrix barcode (or two-dimensional barcode) first designed for the automotive industry in Japan, according to Wikipedia. A barcode is a machine-readable optical label

used. The QR Code system became popular outside the automotive industry due to its fast readability and greater storage capacity compared to standard UPC barcodes. Applications include product tracking, item identification, time tracking, document management and general marketing.

A QR code consists of black modules (square dots) arranged in a square grid on a white background, which can be read by an imaging device, such as a camera, and processed using Reed-

that contains information about the item to which it is attached. A QR code uses four standardized encoding modes to efficiently store data, and extensions may also be

RATON — The Latin Comedy Jam rolls into the Shuler Theater for an 8 p.m. show of stand-up comedians Saturday night (March 21). The company regularly tours Texas, Colorado, Arizona, and New Mexico, with each show presenting three or four of a revolving cast of stand-up comics that sometimes includes Paul Rodriguez and Steve Treviño.

The Shuler Theater show will present comics well on their way to gaining that level of fame. Dillon Garcia is the youngest comic ever featured on Comedy Central, and he's also been a regular performer on Stand-Up Revolution hosted by Gabriel Iglesias. Fellow comics Jerry Garcia and Roberto Rodriguez will join Dillon Garcia on the Shuler stage.

The show will be hosted by Mike G., who has appeared in the major Hollywood films "Three Kings" with George Clooney, Mark Wahlberg, and Ice Cube, and "Any Given Sunday" with Al Pac-

extracted from patterns present in both horizontal and vertical components of the image, according to Wikipedia.

Simpleman said the purpose of the new tourism effort was to create packages that allow independent or guided local tours that highlight local points of interest. Its objectives are to create an interest in local history for both locals and visitors, to provide

incentives for visits, to serve as a means for people to plan vacations and reunions, to act as a portal for community assets and to provide job opportunities for students.

The plan's strategy will be to form partnerships with organizations and outlying communities, to establish a steering committee and to establish an Internship with Trinidad State for student support. The strategy will include an inventory of all existing tourism information, planning a phased approach to tourism efforts, collecting available tourism-related information and digitizing it, developing text and audio files that can be downloaded on smart devices and creating tourism packages.

Simpleman followed with a list of functional requirements for the new tourism efforts. Some of the informational requirements would include points of interest text and audio files to be added to the repository on the website, links to Web Pages and organizational information and ideas for new downloads.

Other communities have utilized QR Reader technology to boost their tourism efforts and Trinidad can do that too. Simpleman said it

was just a matter of bringing multiple parties together on a project that used the best possible technology in the efforts to bring more visitors to Trinidad and Las Animas County. The technical know-how of the staff and students of Trinidad State would be a critical part of that effort, he said.

"The idea is that people, with just a click of their smart phone or their iPad, if they're down in Dallas, Texas, and they're planning a trip up to Denver, they can get on the Internet and they can see all the attractions available to them in Trinidad and Las Animas County," Simpleman said.
